

SPRING 1-YEAR 6

MERLIN

In English this half term, we are going to use the BBC television series as our stimulus for visual literacy. From this, we will be writing our own version of the mythical events that surround Merlin. We will be focusing on grammar to develop our sentences and what they are comprised of. Author's intent and voice will also be key areas of development this half term.

MATHS

This half term, we will be focusing on shape including 2D shapes, coordinates, including translation and reflection, measurement and methods for the four operations in calculations. To develop these skills further, the children will need to be able to apply these in the context of word problems and reasoning. Weekly homework allows children to practise the skills further at home.

LIVING THINGS AND THEIR HABITATS

In science this half term, we will be learning about classifying living things scientifically using the method first described by the scientist Carl Linnaeus. We will also investigate organisms and micro-organisms in their natural habitat and how the environment surrounding them affects their habitat's growth.



ANCIENT EGYPT

For our creative topic, we will be looking at Ancient Egypt. We will be looking at the jobs that they had during this time, how they communicated and the artefacts that they left behind which now have an impact on today's society.

CREATIVE HOMEWORK

As Ancient Egypt is famous for its pyramids, we would love for you to create your own pyramids. They can be made from various materials and should be brought in week beginning the 11th February to allow the children to have an opportunity to showcase their masterpieces.
